About Inclusive Futures

Inclusive Futures brings together the expertise in disability and development from specialists and global leaders at 16 international organisations. The six-year initiative is funded by UK aid and is working in Bangladesh, Jordan, Kenya, Nigeria, Nepal, Tanzania and Uganda with public and private sectors, people with disabilities, and the organisations representing them. People with disabilities are at the heart of the approach and our projects ensure their voices are heard every step of the way.





Nigeria

Inclusive Futures projects in Nigeria span health, education, employment, tackling stigma and discrimination, and supporting a disability-inclusive response to COVID-19. In Kogi State, we're piloting an inclusive approach to eye health, improving access to eye care for women and men with disabilities. In Kaduna state we're developing a community-focused model for inclusive primary school education, and across the country, jobseekers with disabilities are being supported to find formal employment. With our media partners we produce creative, thought-provoking programming to challenge negative social attitudes around disability. Since the COVID-19 pandemic, Inclusive Futures has carried out rapid accessibility audits of COVID-19 testing centres and treatment units, helping to remove barriers and improve accessibility.



Our aims

Our goal is to see a future that is disability-inclusive, where people with disabilities are afforded the same opportunities to access quality health care, education and find meaningful employment without fear of stigma or discrimination. We're also working to build back from the COVID-19 pandemic in a disability-inclusive way, addressing both the urgent needs of people with disabilities during the crisis and ensuring the response takes disability into consideration. Over the six years, Inclusive Futures will pilot innovative new ideas and generate research, evidence and learning into disability-inclusive development in order to make lasting change.
