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## About Inclusive Futures

Inclusive Futures brings together the expertise in disability and development from specialists and global leaders at 16 international organisations. The six-year initiative is funded by UK aid and is working in Bangladesh, Jordan, Kenya, Nigeria, Nepal, Tanzania and Uganda with public and private sectors, people with disabilities, and the organisations representing them. People with disabilities are at the heart of the approach and our projects ensure their voices are heard every step of the way.





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## Tanzania

In Tanzania, Inclusive Futures is tackling stigma and discrimination around disability and improving access to early education for children with disabilities. Partner organisation BBC Media Action has been producing special editions of the popular youth radio show, Niambie, covering various disability issues that affect young people across the country. The show reached 1.4 million listeners in its first season and research showed a positive impact on perceptions of disability. Our education projects focus on pre-primary and primary schooling, improving access for children with disabilities and enhancing their educational outcomes.

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## Our aims

Our goal is to see a future that is disability-inclusive, where people with disabilities are afforded the same opportunities to access quality health care, education and find meaningful employment without fear of stigma or discrimination. We're also working to build back from the COVID-19 pandemic in a disability-inclusive way, addressing both the urgent needs of people with disabilities during the crisis and ensuring the response takes disability into consideration. Over the six years, Inclusive Futures will pilot innovative new ideas and generate research, evidence and learning into disability-inclusive development in order to make lasting change.
