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Context: Facilitators & barriers to SRH/FP services

Facilitators:

- Knowledge about SRH/FP services
- Male implication in SRH/FP issues
- Willingness and awareness of health center staff of the importance of making improvements to facilitate access for people with disabilities
- Country commitment for the inclusion of people with disabilities

Barriers:

- Health center infrastructure not adapted for physical disability
- Geographically far location: unable to easily access information
- SRH/FP information at health center not accessible to all
- The lack of training for medical staff on specific technical skills for the care of people with disabilities as it relates to SRH/FP.
- Progress of country engagement for the inclusion of people with disabilities is slow








Enabling environment: National FP Curriculum

- National Curriculum used to train all SRH/FP service providers.
- Curriculum composed of 3 documents: reference manual, trainer guide, & participant handbook.
- Curriculum did not address people with disabilities.
 - The section on conducting a FP consultation includes information on FP for specific groups (adolescents, men, women living with HIV/AIDS, etc.).
- HI elaborated a new module on disability and inclusion to insert in the Curriculum. Also, added information about the rights of people with disabilities to the Curriculum introduction.
- Module was validated by the Ministry of Health.
